New trees for Candlewick

Our artist's impression gives you an indication of how King William Street should soon look following a successful bid by your Candlewick Ward Team for environmental improvements.

There are also plans for new planters between the Monument Station junction and London Bridge, and for more green window-boxes throughout the Ward. The number one issue both residents and businesses have raised with us over the last year as your

elected representatives has been improving the area environment by making the Ward greener.

We are delighted to be able to announce that this is now well underway. Ground testing has already taken place along King William Street to identify the best locations for the new trees, and we are told that they will be planted in Spring 2024. If you are keen to support the greening of our Ward and would like further information about the flower box scheme, please contact the ward team.



Eastern Cluster Business Improvement District

After a successful referendum of larger business taxpayers in the Eastern part of the City, the Eastern Cluster Business Improvement District ("EC BID") has been established, with an annual budget of about £3.5 million.

Its purpose is to improve the area economically, culturally and environmentally, and details of how it is working can be found at https://ecbid.co.uk . We are working with the EC BiD to promote specific schemes in our Ward, as well as ensuring that the Ward benefits from the more general EC BiD programmes.

Among our current asks are the promotion of Abchurch Yard

for wider community use and the installation of high-quality artwork showing the historical development of London, in place of plain hoardings scheduled to be in place for the next three years on and between Cannon Street and King William Street where building works continue.

We want to include all interested local residents and workers in the process of working out how this money should be spent in our area over the next few years, so we are inviting you to join a dedicated WhatsApp Group if you'd like to be kept informed and to have your say. The future of Abchurch Yard: An open space for Candlewick

St Mary Abchurch churchyard has been transformed into a vibrant and well-used space by providing seats and tables for the use of patrons of Harry's Bar and The Vintry (the adjacent restaurant and bar).

It's been a real success, bringing a key open space in our Ward back into good use, and St Mary Abchurch is to be congratulated for facilitating this improvement. For this



change to become permanent, however, we need to gain planning permission from the City Corporation.

As your elected Candlewick Ward Team we've given the planning application our full support, but were surprised to see an objection lodged. Candlewick Elector to be Lord Mayor

Repairs to London Bridge

Your Candlewick Ward Team are frustrated at the unacceptable state of the flagstones at the north end of London Bridge, which we use like many of you on a daily basis.

Having raised this matter several times with TFL - who manage the pedestrian walkway - we are told the remedial works could be in the region of six years! We are not going to leave it there. Alderman Professor Emma Edhem will now be taking this up with the Board of the City Bridge Foundation where she sits as a Trustee, with the aim of securing the funding for these urgent repairs.
