Our Alderman is Re-elected

We are delighted to announce that at the close of Aldermanic Nominations for the Ward of Candlewick on January 9th 2024 our Alderman, Professor Emma Edhem, was declared the sole candidate to be properly nominated for election and will be duly returned as your Alderman at the Wardmote to be held this Wednesday lunchtime at St Mary Abchurch.

In 2018 Emma was elected as your Alderman after a hotly contested election with four candidates. Aldermen are required to re-stand for election every six years, giving you the electors the opportunity to express your continued democratic confidence.

The first requirement is to secure five valid nominations from the Ward's register of electors. If all five nominations are secured, the next stage is to obtain the plurality of votes from electors in the Ward in a poll. *(cont. overleaf)* We, your Councillors, are delighted to see a clear message from the Ward of Candlewick, where Emma is securely back as our Alderman for another six years as the only candidate who was able to secure the full complement of nominations bringing her back to the role without need of a poll.

Consequently, the poll scheduled for February 1st has been cancelled, and Emma will be declared re-elected at the Wardmote this Wednesday lunchtime, to which you are invited and encouraged to

Join us at the Wardmote

The word "Wardmote" is Saxon in origin, reflecting the fact that, for over a thousand years, electors in each of London's Wards met to conduct local business.

In more modern times, the Wardmote has become a public forum where City of London electors, such as yourself, have the right to attend, speak, ask questions about local issues and importantly work together with your elected Ward Team to promote improvements in the Ward, and in the case of Candlewick, going the extra mile beyond duties expected of us to further create a community of friends, contacts and support.

Each Ward has three Wardmotes: an annual Wardmote, in March; a Wardmote convened in any year of election (or re-election) of the Ward Alderman; and in the case

A number of you have been in contact with us regarding rough-sleeping and we want to thank those of you who've used the details on the candlewick website to 'flag' rough sleeping to the Corporation and St Mungo's support team. Further information on the work we're doing (and how you can get involved) is available on the website; we're delighted to support the opening of the 29-bedroomed hostel last year and this year, the new Rough Sleeping Assessment Centre.

Your Questions on Road Safety

We have arranged for Officers to attend the Wardmote on 21 March to explain the road safety improvements planned for our area and to allow local residents and city workers to express concerns about what other local issues with our roads and pavements need to be addressed. Do please continue to engage with us and join us in March.

Road Safety at Bank's Cannon Street entrance

At the last Wardmote, we responded to concerns about safely crossing Cannon Street at the new entrance to Bank Station, saying that we were pressing for a pedestrian crossing. We are delighted to report that works have just begun to deliver a new signalised crossing there. Once completed, this should also help to alleviate some of the pressures at Monument Junction.



Green spaces awards

In the Square Mile, the Corporation maintains many green spaces. Last year, the City received 15 Green Flag Awards and five London in Bloom Awards. As your local Councillors, we are working hard to support improvements to the natural environment in Candlewick Ward, with exciting proposals for our Ward coming up for consideration at a Guildhall meeting in March. Ambition 25

The City Corporation will be continuing engagement to create and promote its "Ambition 25", through which the Corporation plans for better careers, fair pay and making the City Corporation an attractive place to work. Monument Junction

Early improvements this year to this section of our street system are firmly proposed, but the precise timing of those improvements is not yet confirmed. We'll let you know as and when a final decision is made. These changes will improve the current layout on the King William Street and Cannon Street arms of Monument junction, but signalised crossings will only be possible when TfL reconfigures and rebuilds the junction itself.
